

SPOTLIGHT ON MISSION OF THE MONTH for June is Personal Care Kit Lutheran World Relief

When natural disaster strikes or political conflict flares, families often have little chance to gather their belongings before fleeing the danger. They arrive in a refugee camp, or other place of safety, scared, vulnerable and dirty from travel. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit allow them to wash away dirt and sweat with the fresh scent of soap and the softness of a towel, reminders of someone's care and concern for them in their plight.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended

Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping

One adult-size tooth brush in its original packaging*

One sturdy comb (no picks or fine-toothed combs); remove packaging

One metal nail clippers (attached file optional); remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbon or yarn. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Church Council Minutes May 10th, 2016

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM

- Pastor opened with prayer
- Wayne Kauffmann read devotions
- Minutes of April's meeting were reviewed and amended. Wayne Kauffmann moved that the minutes be approved as amended; motion was seconded by Pam Sauls.
 Motion passed.
- Sue Rambeau presented the Treasurer's report. Giving through March is nearly 10% ahead of last year. Tom Wesbecher moved that the report be accepted as read; John Greer seconded. The motion passed.
- Old business was discussed;

- Deb Keppel has agreed to be the financial secretary, and will be paid \$150 per month.
- Pam Sauls suggested we have have Worship Service in the round building at the park on the morning of the Church picnic. Worship at 10:00 and begin the picnic at 11:30. It was decided that we should talk to members of the congregation informally, get their feedback on this idea, and vote on it at the June meeting.
- The Troy Foundation Grant status was discussed.
- The Tipp City Façade grants don't mention Churches; Sue will check to verify if Churches qualify.
- It was decided to research the Miami County Foundation grant procedures.
