

Family Abuse Shelter of Miami County

Located in Troy, the Family Abuse Shelter provides a safe haven for women and their children who are involved in an abusive relationship. The shelter provides a temporary home for these women until they are able to make it on their own. There can be as many as 22 people in the shelter at any time.

Following is a list of items needed to make life a little easier for them:

dishes
glassware
coffee mugs
knives, forks, spoons
pots and pans
kitchen chairs (they need 12; currently have 7)
batteries - AA and C
toilet paper
paper towels
Clorox wipes
cleaning supplies

Heroin kills at least 23 Ohioans each week. Sally Jason (the late Walt Jason's wife) phoned the office to inform us of an event taking place at the Miami County Fairgrounds on Friday, July 8 and Saturday, July 9. Ohio has one of the largest heroin problems in the U.S.A. A gathering of churches and concerned individuals in our community will be at the Fair Grounds to address this issue.

WHO ARE WE: Hope Over Heroin is a collaborative ministry led by Pastors in Ohio and Kentucky who came together to connect the Body of Christ in order to Break the chains of the Addicted! In 2014, Our Pastoral Team became heartbroken witnessing the losses from addiction like never experienced before. That realization led to mobilizing prayer warriors and compassion evangelism in the streets, specifically in areas that were most impacted and ravaged from the epidemic of Heroin, Opiates and Drug Related issues. The natural outflow of bringing the Holy Spirit to those that needed Him most, began the planning of the first of many Hope Over Heroin events across the country!

WHAT DO WE DO: Hope Over Heroin unites
Churches and cities to pray together. We begin
active street evangelism in areas most impacted,
raising real Kingdom awareness to collective
addiction problems that surround us. Our heart is
connecting people to practical redemptive
ministries by providing an outreach bridge for a
dying generation and bringing it Hope. Hope Over
Heroin is much more than a weekend outreach. We
unite regional faith-based, non-faith based,
addiction recovery and grief resources at one
place, most often for the first time, and connect
those hurting the most with long term support and
resources.

COMMITTEE REPORTS



Highlights of the June 14 Meeting

- The treasurer's report was approved as presented. As expenses were quite high for the month, council suggested mentioning in the weekly bulletin that they included the annual insurance premium of approximately \$8,000.
- It was announced that Deb Keppel had assumed her duties as the Church Financial Secretary and would begin attending the monthly Financial Committee meetings.
- Council voted to approve holding worship service at 10:00 a.m. in the Tipp City Park, in the round building on the day of the picnic, August 28, 2016. The picnic will be held after worship, at around 11:30 a.m.to 12:00 p.m. A task group will be formed at the July Council meeting to carry out assignments, such as getting the chicken, setting up chairs, and whatever else is deemed necessary for a successful worship service and picnic.
- It was decided to hold a congregational meeting on July 3, following worship, in the

sanctuary, to vote on the repairs to the west and south walls of the original building, and possibly the roof area as well. Property contacted General Preservation Corporation in Columbus, and they are honoring the original quotation to complete the work. As the contract will be for \$15,000, congregational approval is needed, plus Council felt a decision this important needed to be brought before the congregation, in order to maintain full transparency of all major decisions. This vote will be by show of hands, and will be the only issue brought to the floor for this meeting.

- Council approved mounting a "Knox Box" outside the building, at the Walnut Street entrance, to allow the fire department access to the building in emergency situations. The cost will be \$336.
- Vacation Bible School is scheduled to take place the week of June 27th, and Jackie is still seeking volunteers to help.
