No way around it there is suffering and pain before the resurrection!

MISSION OF THE MONTH The Good Samaritan Fund

This fund assists individuals with utility bill help, rental assistance, gas, an emergency hotel stay, etc. No cash is given to the individual. We help in the form of a check to the utility or rental company. A gas card, only good for fuel, is given when needed by an individual. For a hotel stay we work out an agreement with the person in charge. For food assistance we refer them to the Food Pantry. We do keep a list of individuals and their request in order to control repetitive requests.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Worship & Music - Weds., October 23, 2020

• In attendance were Terri Darrah, Pastor Glawe, Linda Holt, Deb Keppel, Kervyn Mach, and Lori Sebastian. Pastor started the meeting in prayer. We reviewed upcoming services. Pastor said on All Saints Day we would have a sharing time for memories, chimes during the prayers, and the congregational meeting and dinner. Lori will work on getting advent readers for the candle lighting at the advent services. Christmas Eve will have 2 services – 5pm and 7:30pm. We plan for the kids to play chimes at early services and the choir will sing two anthems at the later service. For liturgy, we will continue setting 4 until advent and then move to setting 1 for the advent/Christmas/epiphany seasons.

Terri reported all is going well with choir. Pieces are chosen through November. We ordered 3 additional pieces through JW Pepper. We have a great group of people again and are trying a wide variety of music! We will be off the following Sundays: Sunday, Nov. 10th and Sunday, Dec. 8th (kids' Christmas program). We will not have rehearsal Weds., Nov. 27th (Thanksgiving week) nor over Christmas break. Choir Party will likely be scheduled the first Wednesday we are back after break: January 8th.

Deb talked about altar concerns. A chalice ordered is more challenging to distribute continuous communion. If we find something more similar to our original chalice, we may order that in the future. Pastor and Carla discussed seasonal changes for the paraments previously and Deb will coordinate the Christmas nativity and other (tree) decorations. There was also mention of what we would do long term for the seasonal banners; that will be researched. Deb also mentioned that she would like to find another pianist for some of the Saturday evening services, as she picked up a 2nd Saturday earlier this summer. This would be a commitment of one Saturday a month. If you are interested, please see Lori or Pastor.

Lori talked about the bell choir. We will have a bell ensemble – Sunday, November 10th. We will have

4 ringers and Susie Gray will be accompanying on piano. We will likely have chimes or bells early Christmas Eve. We ordered 3 additional volumes 4-6 ringer bell music – appropriate for a smaller ensemble and/or a summer group. With the vocal choir and bell choir music ordered, that depletes our music budget for 2019. We found many new pieces at the Augsburg Summer Music Clinic.
