Advent is a time of preparation. One beloved song during Advent which many Christians are familiar is the Magnificat, specifically music and text written to express Mary's song of praise in Luke 1:46-55: My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. And his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his offspring forever.

During the Advent and Christmas season, another text is often read – the Benedictus (**Blessed be the Lord God of Israel**) – found in Luke 1:68-79. Zechariah sang this praise for his son John the Baptist's circumcision. The words commemorate the hope that the Messiah is coming and the role that his own son had in the divine story. Quite the celebration considering John was a miracle that occurred being born to older parents (Zechariah and Elizabeth); this song by Zechariah were his first words after being mute for several months!

Lastly during Epiphany, a text is read which is titled The Nunc Dimittis. The elderly priest Simeon, who had waited most of his life for the Messiah to come, had a vision from the Holy Spirit that he would not leave earth until He had seen the Promised One. Enter Mary, Joseph, and Baby Jesus to the temple. Simeon sang what we know today as the Nunc Dimittis. Luke 2:29-32. "Now Lord, you let your servant go in peace. Your word has been fulfilled. Mine own eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the sight of every people. A light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel."

Although I had been familiar with all these texts at various points in my upbringing and musical career, it wasn't until recently that I recognized all 3 of these important canticles are in the first 2 chapters of the Scripture of Luke. 3 is a special number in Christian faith (like the concept of the Trinity). And I have to think these 3 canticles are more than just "coincidence".

For Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, we will sing various verses from 2 of the canticles prior to the Gospel reading. We will sing ELW 251 (My Soul Proclaims Your Greatness) – which is a

relatively new text published by Augsburg Fortress (1995) based on the Magnificat set to the tune Kingsfold. The English folk tune Kingsfold is a strong minor tune – celebratory, yet reflective. Then during Epiphany, we will sing Blessed Be the God of Israel (ELW 250) – the Benedictus - to the same tune. With repetition, we will add a tune to our repertoire, and sing the different verses of the 2 canticles. During Epiphany, we will sing the Nunc Dimittis as the as part of Setting 1 Liturgy.

#### ELW 251 - My Soul Proclaims Your

Greatness (based on the Magnificat)

1 My soul proclaims your greatness, Lord;
I sing my Savior's praise!
You looked upon my lowliness,
and I am full of grace.
Now ev'ry land and ev'ry age
This blessing shall proclaim—
Great wonders you have done for me,
and holy is your name.

2 To all who live in holy fear your mercy ever flows.
With mighty arm you dash the proud, their scheming hearts expose.
The ruthless you have cast aside,
The lowly throned instead;
the hungry filled with all good things, the rich sent off unfed

3 To Israel, your servant blest, your help is ever sure;
The promise to our parents made their children will secure.
Sing glory to the Holy One,
Give honor to the Word,
And praise the Pow'r of the Most High, one God by all adored.

### **ELW 250 - Blessed Be the God of Israel** (the Benedictus)

1 Blessed be the God of Israel who comes to set us free and raises up new hope for us: a Branch from David's tree. So have the prophets long declared that with a mighty arm God would turn back our enemies and all who wish us harm.

2 With promised mercy will God still the covenant recall, the oath once sworn to Abraham, from foes to save us all; that we might worship without fear and offer lives of praise in holiness and righteousness to serve God all our days.

3 My child, as prophet of the Lord you will prepare the way, to tell God's people they are saved from sin's eternal sway.

Then shall God's mercy from on high shine forth and never cease to drive away the gloom of death and lead us into peace.

# Worship and Music Meeting – Weds. November 4, 2020

On Wednesday, November 4, 2020, the Worship and Music Committee met. Attending were: Terri Darrah, Carla Frame, Pastor Glawe, Susie Gray, Linda Holt, Deb Keppel, Kervyn Mach, and Lori Sebastian. Pastor began the meeting in prayer.

We talked about Christmas. The suggestion, which will be sent to council for feedback, would be two Christmas Eve services held at 5pm and 7:30pm. We would have space for approximately 80 people in the Fellowship Hall and attached Sunday School room with social distancing in effect. We will offer Communion at both services; altar committee will

work out details. We will have the candle lighting (during Silent Night), sing hymns during Communion, and arrange special music for 10 minutes prior to the service.

Vocal choir, bell choir, chime choir continue to be on hold for present

Carla reported on the altar information. The new communion schedule is working well. Sundays where communion is offered, we are seeing a slight attendance bump. Thanks to Colleen Flayler who created an artificial arrangement for us to use during the fall season. Deb reported that Always Blooming is a new florist in Tipp City, and we will be resuming live arrangements in December. We are also ordering poinsettias for Christmas Eve Service. Deb will coordinate the advent candle wreath, manger scene, and tree with Chrismons so are Fellowship Hall is seasonally decorated

Lori thanked everyone for learning Setting 2 this summer and fall. During the Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany seasons we will switch to Setting 1. Further, normally, we do a special family advent reading with the advent wreath. This year, we will have a reflection printed in the bulletin / on the screen for when the appropriate candle(s) will be lit prior to the service. The plan would be to return this "advent reading" custom next advent season, post COVID!

Pastor provided some additional updates. He thanked everyone for their efforts. He also was excited to announce that Dale Schaefer will be aiding him with congregational visits and worship services starting at the end of November. Welcome Dale!

We talked about remote worship. There are still some sound issues with volume level being set appropriately for in person worship versus the recording. While we were meeting, Chuck Powder was working with sound technicians to install some new equipment, so we are hopeful that will improve the quality.
