

MISSION OF THE MONTH The Good Samaritan Fund

This fund assists individuals with utility bill help, rental assistance, gas, an emergency hotel stay, etc. No cash is given to the individual. We help in the form of a check to the utility or rental company. A gas card, only good for fuel, is given when needed by an individual. For a hotel stay we work out an agreement with the person in charge. For food assistance we refer them to the Food Pantry. We do keep a list of individuals and their request in order to control repetitive requests.

- 1. Council approved September financials.
- 2. Council approved October meeting minutes.
- 3. Approved the final draft of the proposed budget for 2022. It will be mailed to voting members and voted on at the annual meeting.
- 4. There will be going-away receptions for Pastor Jeff and Jackie after services on December 18 and 19.
- 5. Jessica Dorn will be the new Christian Education director.
- 6. The recent power outage disclosed that 20 or more of the emergency lights (we have about 50) need new batteries.

WORSHIP & MUSIC – Weds. Nov. 10, 2021

On Wednesday, November 10, 2021, Worship and Music Committee met. In attendance were: Pastor Glawe, Susie Gray, Bill Jones, Deb Keppel, Kervyn Mach, and Lori Sebastian. We discussed upcoming dates. Advent will begin November 27 and 28. Pastor and Jackie Glawe's "last weekend" will be December 18 and 19. Women of Zion will be hosting a farewell reception following both services. Worship Christmas Eve will be Friday December 24th at 5pm and 7:30pm – with Communion at both services.

During Advent, we will be asking families to help with the lighting of the Advent candles. Ohio Valley British Brass Band will be giving a concert December 10; Linda Holt will check with custodial staff on set up and tear down. We are still finalizing Christmas Eve music – with intent for bells to ring at the 5pm service and vocal choir to sing at the 7:30pm service.

Bill and Susie gave several updates for the choir. Music has been selected for the remainder of 2021. Lori expressed much gratitude for their planning! The choir party will likely be Wednesday December 22nd, following rehearsal. Once the choir sings Christmas Eve, rehearsals will resume Weds. January 5th.

Lori thanked the bell ringers for their recent playing. It was a welcome return after nearly a 2-year hiatus. Lori also thanked Pastor Glawe for his 7 years of service and leadership as this was his last worship and music meeting.

We discussed altar concerns. We will have Communion December 5 (Sunday), December 11 (Saturday), December 19 (Sunday), and Christmas Eve both services. Deb Keppel will take care of setting up the advent wreath. Kathy Groth will handle decorating the Chrismon tree.

During Advent we will change to Setting 1 for the liturgy; the final Composer of the Month column (Wayne Wold) will appear in the December newsletter.

Pastor updated us: the "lights out" service with acapella singing worked well, the congregational meeting is upcoming, he is beginning his last Sunday School class at Zion, Women of Zion hosting a Christmas party Dec. 2, tree lighting on Dec. 3 (6-8pm), and he welcomed Jessica Dorn as Sunday School Director.

Our next meeting date is Weds., January 12th at 1pm.

COMPOSER OF THE MONTH by Lori Sebastian

December's composer of the month is Wayne Wold. At 16 years old, Wold began his church music career. He has served congregations in Minnesota, Ohio, and Maryland. He received his bachelors of music degree from Concordia College (Moorhead, Minnesota), masters of sacred music degree from Wittenberg University and his doctor of musical arts from Shenandoah University, where he currently (as of 2000) is on faculty.

Wold has written and published over 400 pieces including works for organ, choral, and organ with instruments. He spent most of his career (1990-2020) at Hood College in Maryland. He also served 17 years as director of chapel music at Camp David. He has performed on organ and harpsichord across the United States and Europe; he has also been clinician or presented at various organizations including the American Guild of Organists, Association of Lutheran Church Musicians, and Choristers Guild.

Wold has also written hymns. He has received several awards – two recent ones are noteworthy: winner of the ELCA hymn writing contest for 2018

and winner of the ALCM hymn writing contest for 2019. The 2018 hymn God's Work, Our Hands (sung to the tune Earth and All Stars) is shown below:
