Pastoral Services

On a final note, please, please, please let me know when you are undergoing surgery, admitted to the hospital, or going to a major doctor's appointment. I am always happy to visit and pray over you. I promise I won't stay too long unless that is your wish. I don't care if you are in Downtown Dayton or up in Sidney, I love nothing more than to be there for members of the community when they are undergoing major life events.

As I wrap up this article, I implore you to please reach out to your pastor. I am here to provide support and pastoral guidance in a variety of situations. I may be busy, but I will always make time to be with those in our community. I would love nothing more than to help you grow in your walk with Christ.

Southern Ohio Synod Assembly Report June 6th - 7th, 2025

The theme of this year's Synod Assembly was "Anchored in Christ, Freed to Serve," and it was held at the Columbus Zoo Event Center overlooking the magnificent Heart of Africa exhibit. Zion Lutheran Church of Tipp City member attendees included church council president Denise Jacobs and Lara Jacobs.

We arrived at the event center Friday noon to register and collect our materials. Attendees gathered at large round tables and the general mood was enthusiastic as we were able to enjoy beautiful weather and a wall of floor-to-ceiling glass doors opening up to a large patio overlooking the giraffe enclosure, which also contained zebras, antelope, wildebeests, three species of gazelles, various large birds, and numerous other animals. We were able to observe the animals the entirety of the assembly and everyone agreed it to be an ideal venue. Notably, various breaks enabled attendees to enjoy exploring the entire zoo through the passes that came as part of the assembly package.

It was a pleasure to find ourselves serendipitously seated at a table which included the new pastor of West Milton's Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Rev. Rachel Semovoski, and her husband Rev. Joshua Semovoski, USAA chaplain at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, as well as Pastor Benjamin from St. John's Lutheran Church in Vandalia.

After going over some general introductions and schedule information, the first Plenary opened with a Call to Worship, and we commenced business and voting. In a welcome surprise of the voting process, Bishop Suzanne Darcy Dillahunt was re-elected as synod bishop on the very first ballot, so no further voting was needed and freed up the schedule considerably.

In other voting, Financial Reports and Budgets for the 2026-2027 church year, as well as the 2027-2028 church year were approved, as there will not be a synod assembly next year. We also passed votes electing new Synod Council members and the Synod Disciplinary Committee.

Numerous presentations were given throughout both days highlighting various programs and resources for clergy, lay people, and congregations. Those resources can be found and explored on the synod's website; www.southernohiosynod.com.

Bishop Dillahunt went over the Synod Strategic Plan, and was re-installed Friday evening after dinner during the wonderful Assembly Worship Service, which was accompanied by energetic and inspiring music by the Tony Hagood Jazz Quintet. We sang "When the Saints Go Marching In" and other praiseful hymns, and for a while it seemed we might have been at a New Orleans Synod Assembly!

Business resumed Saturday morning with more of the aforementioned presentations, and anniversary celebrations for congregations and rostered ministers. Assistant to the Bishop Rev. Bob Abrams spoke about relying on the Holy Spirit in the call process, which featured a video of our very own Linda Holt telling the story of finally receiving the candidate who we were so blessed to call and ordain in Pastor Jaren Summers!

The Assembly wrapped up after more reports, including the Report of the ELCA, and we adjourned and celebrated the Closing of the Assembly.

How Can I Get Involved?



We are so happy to welcome new people to our congregation. We've been asked about ways to plug in to activities. To provide information about the multitude of opportunities, this is the first of a new ongoing section in Tidings, which describes a specific ministry area and ways to become involved. This month we are highlighting **Ushers**.

For the Sunday morning church service, we have one or two **USHERS** to help facilitate the service. It's an easy job but certainly essential. As an usher, you are asked to do the following:

- 1. Please arrive by 9:45 a.m.
- 2. **Unlock the front door** (Main St. door). Turn the dead bolt above the handle to unlock it. Open the door, turn the door lock and pull the inside handle down. Make sure the outside handle turns.



- 3. **Pass out bulletins**. If someone hasn't brought them to the sanctuary, they can be found on the table in the office workroom.
 - We provide large print bulletins for the visually impaired.
 - We provide music sheets for people who have difficulty holding hymnals.
- 4. **Count and record the number of worshippers**, including the pastor, organist, choir and acolyte. The attendance slip is on top of the bulletins in the workroom. If it's missing, there are some in the white plastic container in the Main St. entrance. Put the completed slip in the offering plate.
- 5. The offering plate is not passed it stays on the little table in the back of the sanctuary.
- After the service, take any bulletins left in the pews to the white recycling bin in the hallway.
 Take any bulletins that you didn't hand out back to the office workroom.
- 7. Straighten any hymnals etc. that are out of place.
- 8. Lock the front door.
- 9. Take offerings from the plate to the office workroom and deposit them in the grey lock box hanging on the wall next to the filing cabinet. Please make sure the envelopes completely drop into the box.

If you are interested in being an usher, we pass around sign-up sheets every other month during service. After that, you can check the sheets in the fellowship hall for openings.
