Praying an Ancient Prayer in Advent

I am incredibly excited for the meaningful worship we will experience this Advent season. As always, we will have the Advent Wreath, the manger scene in front of the altar (the chancel), beloved hymns, and more! I am especially excited for our communion liturgy. It will look a little different from what we are familiar with because we will be celebrating communion as it was celebrated over 1800 years ago! Around 215 AD, Hippolytus of Rome wrote a short book entitled, *The Apostolic Tradition*. Not much is known about Hippolytus, but we can say that he was a bishop in Rome who was concerned about innovations in worship that were corrupting the faith as it had been passed down from the apostles. Hippolytus wanted to preserve the worship of the church and so he wrote this book to maintain the historic liturgy of the church. The fascinating part is that Hippolytus' liturgical formulations were evidently correct— his liturgy has been corroborated by earlier Christian writers such as Tertullian.

Now, why do I share this? In *The Apostolic Tradition* Part I.4, Hippolytus records the eucharistic liturgy as it had been historically practiced in the early church. This is the exact same liturgy we will be practicing throughout Advent! If you are interested, this liturgy is found in our red hymnals (page 69, Form XI). This eucharistic liturgy fits naturally into Advent. As we celebrate holy communion, we look back at Christ's birth with fondness while simultaneously looking to the future with hopeful expectation as we await his return in glory - which is the very purpose of Advent. We will hear of the Word made flesh - sent from heaven to a virgin womb, born of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary. We will recount Christ's life, death and resurrection through which he destroyed death, broke the bonds of the evil one, and crushed hell underfoot.

And then, as we come forward to encounter Christ in our midst— receiving the gift of his body and blood— we will be joined with all the saints, our ancestors in the faith, who have celebrated this very same liturgy for over 1800 years! I am looking forward to Advent and I hope you are as well.




What's New

November 3rd, 2025


- Vantage signs are making new sign boards for the marquee out front and a new sign for the cemetery on Hyatt.

Devotion: “Thankful for the Family That Serves”

When we gather for worship, we come not only to sing and pray, but to remember who we are - together. We are a family formed by faith, sustained by kindness, and called to serve. In this season of gratitude, let us pause to give thanks for the Church Family: for those who sit beside us in the pews, and for those we may never meet but still reach through our acts of love.

We are more than a congregation - we are a living sanctuary. A place where casseroles become communion, porch visits become pastoral care, and every shared burden becomes a sacred bond. Our church family is not defined by walls, but by the way we hold each other up.

Scripture Reflection:

 *Galatians 6:10* — “So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.”

This verse reminds us that our first circle of care is our church family - but it doesn't end there. The goodness we cultivate here spills outward, touching lives beyond our walls. We are called to be a wellspring of compassion, not a reservoir.

December Musician's Corner - *Rejoice, Rejoice Believers!*

December's hymn of the month is *Rejoice, Rejoice Believers* found in Evangelical Lutheran Worship Hymn # 244. The text for this song was penned by Laurentius Laurenti (1660-1722). Laurenti was born in Husum, in the Duchy of Schleswig, which was part of Denmark but is presently located in northern Germany. Laurenti was educated at the University of Rostock and Kiel. He was appointed as music director (cantor) at the Lutheran cathedral in Bremen.

Laurenti is considered one of the best German hymn writers of the Pietistic (or Pietistic Lutheranism) movement. Although many of his hymns are still used in the original German, there are just 3 of his hymns translated into English, which are still used with some regularity: (1) O Thou Essential Word (a Christmas hymn), (2) Flow My Tears, O Flow Still Faster (a Holy Week hymn), and (3) Rejoice, Rejoice Believers – a hymn for the second Sunday in Advent. The text of this hymn describes the parable of the wise and foolish maidens, based on Matthew 25:1-13.

This German text was translated to English by Sarah Findlater (1823-1907). Sarah was born in Edinburgh, Scotland. She married a pastor in the Free Church in Scotland. Her sister (Jane Laurie Borthwick) also had translations included in the work "German Hymns from the Land of Luther", so both Findlater and Borthwick were skilled in writing and translating from German to English.

In our hymnbook, *Rejoice, Rejoice, Believers* is set to Swedish folk tune: HAF TRONES LAMPA FARDIG (translated means keep your trimmed lamps ready). If you wanted to find a "newer" hymn that had the same Scriptural principles you could turn in All Creation Sings to Hymn #949 (*Keep Your Lamps Trimmed and Burning*). This Swedish folk tune was first published in the Swedish Homeland Singer in 1891.

Rejoice, Rejoice Believers falls in the meter of 7676D. This means the poetry is in 4 sets of 7 syllable and 6 syllable phrases. I have indicated the "syllables" following each half phrase of the first verse:

Rejoice, rejoice, believers (7) and let your lights appear (6);
The evening is advancing (7), and darker night is near (6).
The bridegroom is arising (7) and soon is drawing nigh (6).
Up, pray and watch and wrestle (7); at midnight comes the cry (6).

If you look in the back indices of the red hymnal (pg. 1199-1203), you will find a Metrical Index of Tunes. As I was researching this tune, some recordings set this text to LLANGLOFFAN (or *Bless Now, O God, the Journey*). Another version set this text to VALET WILL ICH DIR GEBEN (commonly known as *All Glory, Laud and Honor*). All these tunes are in the meter of 7676D. We could even sing *Rejoice, Rejoice Believers* to AURELIA (*The Church's One Foundation*). Try singing a verse to one of the alternate melodies.

The final stanza of *Rejoice, Rejoice Believers* is a prayer for Christ's return, and one which will help us prepare our hearts for Advent:

Our hope and expectation, O Jesus now appear.
Arise O Sun so longer for, o'er this benighted sphere.
With hearts and hands uplifted, we plead, O Lord to see
The day of earth's redemption that sets your people free.
