## "My Country 'tis of Thee"

This month is a big one. All over the country, people will celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the United States of America on July 4th, the day the Declaration of Independence was signed in 1776. This is an important day for many people. It is an important day for me, not simply because I am an avowed lover of history, but because the 250th Anniversary of the U.S. coincides with the 200th anniversary of Zion Lutheran Church. This is the ideal and, more importantly, the truth that all people possess inherent dignity and worth. As Christians, we know this to be true. Genesis 1:26 says that all humans are made in God's image which is why our calling as Christians is to love—to love God and neighbor. Or, as our mission statement so ably puts it: to serve Christ through serving others. That's something we can all get behind.

So let us continue to embrace this year with joy, as our faith community celebrates 200 years of service to God and neighbor. I invite you to take a step back and ponder what it must have been like for those who came before us. I invite you to then ponder where you see God at work in your life and in this community today. Finally, I ask that you approach God with humility and dream of what God may be up to in us, among us, and through us over the many years ahead. I stand in awe of what God has been doing all this time and I hope you do too.

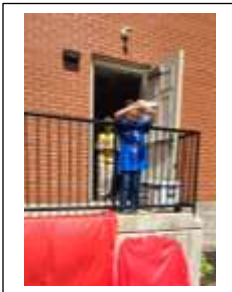

## How Can I Get Involved?

We are so happy to welcome new people to our congregation. We've been asked about ways to plug in to activities. To provide information about the multitude of opportunities, this an ongoing section in Tidings, which describes a specific ministry area and ways to become involved. This month we are highlighting the **TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT TEAM**.

The technical support team handles a wide variety of projects for Zion. These projects range from simple projects that are completed in a day or two to multi-week and multi-year projects that expand the technical operations at Zion. Over the last 5 years, the team has completed many projects at Zion. Some of the completed projects include the sound and video system in the fellowship hall; upgrades to the computer systems used by staff; upgrades to the internet and WiFi capability and the upgrade of the internal records management system. The major upgrade to the systems used in the sanctuary for sound and online services is a multi-year project that has several more phases to complete.

The team needs helpers to complete the wiring in the sanctuary to accommodate additional microphones and speakers. The team also needs volunteers to record the Sunday online services. That will only require some training and a about an extra hour of time on Sunday to prepare for the service and close down everything after service. It is by combining the talents of many individuals that Zion makes progress. If you enjoy working with technology please consider joining our team.

## Council Meeting Report

June 9, 2026



President Matt Sauls provided an update on the newly formed Personnel Committee. The Executive Committee will be meeting with Committee Chair Chuck Drake and Pastor to review the goals and objectives for this important ministry team. The committee's first meeting is scheduled for July 7th. The members of the Personnel Committee are Chair, Chuck Drake; Cindy Tayse; Lara Jacobs; and Diana Ewing. We are grateful for their willingness to serve and for the thoughtful experience each brings to this work.

The President also reported that the recent walkthrough with the Tipp City Safety Resource Officer identified several areas the Safety Committee plans to address. As part of this work, four cameras have been identified for purchase, and additional equipment is currently being reviewed to support this important safety upgrade for the church.

Christian Education Committee, Nate Ewing reported that Children and Youth Updates are as follows:

- **Sunday School:** This past Sunday School year officially concluded on May 17, 2026. Classes will begin for the next school year on September 20, 2026.
- **Questionnaire:** A Google Form questionnaire is currently circulating among our Sunday School families to gather feedback. Once that initial phase is complete, it will be sent out to the wider congregation.
- **Messy Games:** This event is coming up quickly. Interested youth need to be signed up by July 26th.
- **VBS Room:** Ongoing sorting and organization of the supplies that were cleaned out of the VBS room continues slowly but steadily.
- **Fun Faithful Fellowship:** We are currently working on finalizing the activity schedule for July.
- **Sports Closet:** We had a wonderful outreach success this past month. We were able to outfit a Zion family with donated sports gear, saving them approximately \$125.

July Council Preview – Lutheran Saints in Ministry (LSIM). During Council's July meeting, leadership from Abiding Christ Lutheran Church in Fairborn will join us to share information about *Lutheran Saints in Ministry* (LSIM). Lutheran Saints in Ministry is a collaborative mission of the Southern Ohio Synod of the ELCA. Member congregations retain their local autonomy, local character, and local mission, while partnering with LSIM congregations wherever shared ministry can strengthen and enhance the work we do.

The vision of LSIM is to bring together worshiping communities of a common faith to:

- further the work of Jesus Christ,
- strengthen congregations by sharing resources for the common good,
- support the needs and goals of its member congregations,
- provide a framework for ongoing cooperative relationships,
- offer mutual support among congregations, and
- maintain a faithful congregational presence in each community served.

## Be Still My Soul

*Be Still My Soul* is the July hymn of the month. The text is not found in either the red or purple hymnal; however, the tune (FINLANDIA) appears twice in Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW). It is a very comforting text and tune, and sometimes I have confused this text with a similar hymn text *It is Well with My Soul / When Peace Like a River* (ELW 785).

The text was written by Katharina Amalia Dorothea von Schlegel who was born in 1697. The brief biographical information we have on Katharina – she was likely a woman of means and from a noble family. She had some correspondence later in life (1750-1752) with Henry Ernst, the Count of Stolberg. It is believed she served her community in Cothen, where she likely lived in a Lutheran Frauleinstifte, a convent which housed unmarried or widowed noble women. According to C. Michael Hawn (umcdiscipleship.org), “This text appears at the time of German pietism, similar in spirit in many regards to the Wesleyan revival in England of the same era. Philipp Jacob Spener (1635-1705) led the German pietistic movement. Though not a hymn writer himself, he inspired a revival in German hymnody characterized by faithfulness to Scripture, personal experience, and deep emotional expression. Katharina von Schlegel is thought to be the leading female hymn writer of this period.”

Perhaps as significant as the hymn text is the translator. *Stille, mein Wille, dein Jesus hilft siegen* appeared in 6 stanzas in various hymnals beginning in 1752. When she translated the hymn from German to English, Jane Borthwick omitted the third stanza. The version we will sing and learn retains three of the five translated verses. Many are familiar with the woman who translated the most hymns from German to English - Catherine Winkworth. Jane Borthwick and her sister Sarah translated 114 hymns from German to English and published them in Hymns from the Land of Luther (1854). According to American pianist Andrew Remillard, the work of Jane and Sarah “is second only to Catherine Winkworth in quantity and quality.”

The tune for FINLANDIA is historic as well. In 1899, Jean Sibelius wrote a symphonic tone poem by the name Finlandia. This tune was the final (7<sup>th</sup>) in a piece written to musically describe and portray Finnish history. An interesting tidbit: at the time this piece was composed, Russian censorship was felt even by Scandinavian countries, and instead of performing it for Peace Celebrations under its patriotic tune Finlandia, it was retitled: “Happy Feelings at the Awakening of Finnish Spring”. Regardless, Finlandia is a fine tune. It appears twice in our red hymnal:

the patriotic text *This is My Song* (ELW 887) and  
a commemorative text about coping with Alzheimer’s disease *When Memory Fades* (ELW 792).

I will close with the heartfelt first verse.

Be still, my soul; the Lord is on your side;  
Bear patiently the cross of grief or pain;  
Leave to your God to order and provide;  
In ev’ry change He faithful will remain.  
Be still, my soul; your best, your heav’nly, Friend  
Through thorny ways leads to a joyful end.
